This employment Ontario program is funded in part by the Government of Canada and the Government of Ontario.

PARTONE



This program will provide up to 300 Experiential Work
Placements for candidates that meet the program's eligibility requirements.

Work placements will run from 10 to 16 weeks. Consecutive placements will be permitted if completed by March 21, 2025.

Designed to help more people increase their skills for great job opportunities in the precision metal working sector, which includes:

- machining
- tool & die making
- mould making
- jig & fixture building
- automation/robotics
- additive manufacturing
- and, other related businesses

EMPLOYERINFO

- Eligible employers could receive up to 50% of wages paid up to \$5,000, per placement (\$5,000 for single placement; \$10,000 for two placements; \$15,000 for 3 placements).
- Can receive funding for multiple candidates
- Recruit own candidates
- Must permit monitoring visits during these placements where participants will be trained following a list of industry specific competencies that can be tailored to meet individual positions.
- Must pay each participant an hourly rate (at least minimum wage) for the duration of the placement.

CANDIDATE INFO

Career-Ready with CTMA is designed to support experiential learning opportunities, which is a handson learning model where participants learn by doing. The goal is to provide participants with real-world work experience that improves their employability by building their knowledge and skills.

To be eligible for this program, candidates/participants must:

- Be a resident of Ontario, be eligible to work in Canada, and meet one of the following definitions:
 - Individuals who want to start an apprenticeship
 - High school graduates
 - Post-secondary graduates or co-op students
 - Job seekers looking for full-time employment
 - Existing employees looking to upskill
 - Individuals with open work permits awaiting their official documents for permanent residency.
